*Descriptions for PUAD "Topics" Courses

PUAD 694: Topics in Public Admin: Surveillance & Gaze of the Admin. State

Instructor: Holly Goerdel (Associate Professor)

This course explores surveillance and the gaze of government on society. What is the scope of surveillance in daily life? What role is public administration playing in a surveillance society? Finally, what are the important issues, public values and consequences to consider? This course draws on empirical, theoretical and multiple-disciplinary perspectives to these questions. The course is reading and discussion focused; with time also allocated for how to practically grow and improve in these communication areas.

PUAD 839: Topics in Public Admin: The Scope of Public Policy

Instructor: Alesha Doan (Associate Professor)

Introductory graduate course in the examination of public policy making. Considers institutions, basic theoretical frameworks, and standard methods, and places policy-making within a broad political context. Emphasizes American examples, but relevant comparative material is employed.
