PUAD 939 Topics in Public Admin: Sex, Race & Public Policy

Instructor: Alesha Doan (Associate Professor)

Public policies purport to be gender and race neutral. However, in practice, many contemporary policies that impact citizens are foregrounded in historical systems of gender, racial and class oppression. This course critically investigates the origin and impact of several policies that are consequential to peoples' lives and well-being.
